Dear Parents / Carers.

We now find ourselves at the conclusion of week three of the academic year.

The new routines and class names have now all bedded in, and we have now had the majority of the 'new school year' meetings. There are many meetings in the Autumn I half-term as it is part of our ethos to work with parents as partners; we'd like to thank everyone who took time out of their busy schedules to attend any of the meeting that we have hosted over the last three weeks.

On Monday, SLT hosted a parent coffee morning where we shared our **School Development Priorities** (SDPs) for this year, for those not in attendance they are:

- 1.) Continue to improve outcomes for our lowest attaining pupils (30%) across all core subjects.
- 2.) Embed & implement a consistent approach to Curriculum Floor Books which exemplify our quality offer.
- 3.) Continue the development of leadership at all levels.
- 4.) Continue the development of our playground and outdoor learning opportunities.
- 5.) Continue to develop parent partnerships especially for our lowest attaining pupils (30%) so outcomes improve.

As we have done in previous years, we will share our 2023-2024 SDP plan with you and you will receive termly SDP newsletters informing you of the progress we are making against these SDP's.

Last week we informed you about our whole school writing moderation task. All of our pupils have now received three **writing targets**, please speak with your child about their writing targets, and if they are unable to recall them please speak with your child(ren)'s class teacher.

To reiterate, as we get back into the routines of school life please ensure that your child has their **reading record** with them daily and that they are punctual for school, our gates open from 8:45am.
