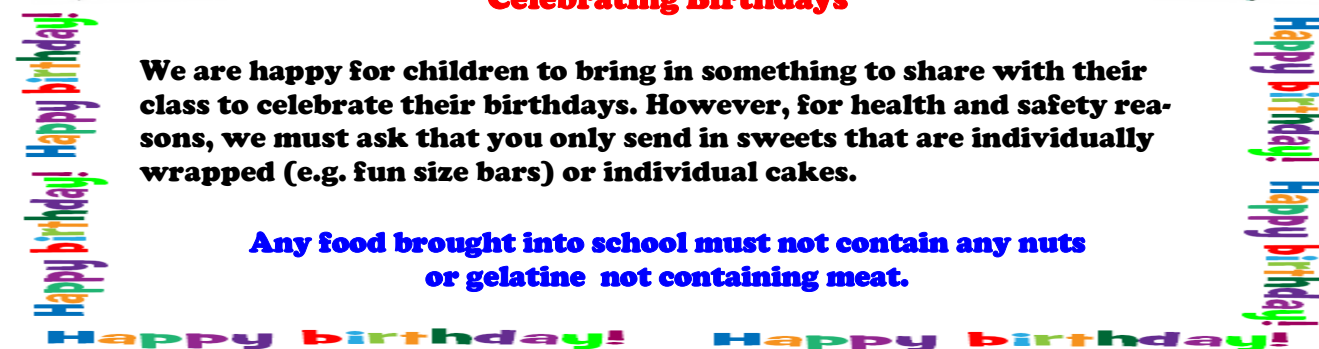


# Reminders for September

## Children are not permitted to wear:

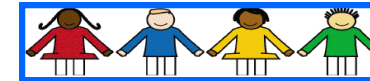

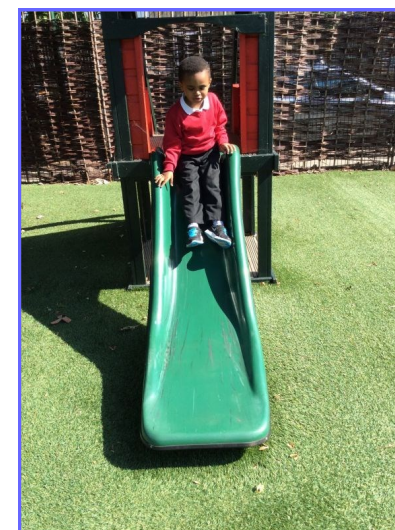

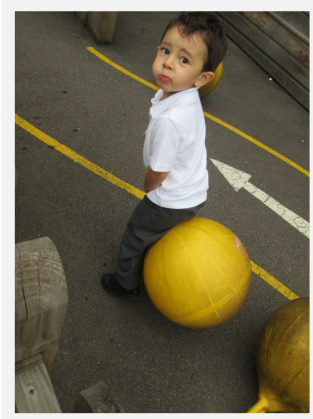
## Welcome to our New Nursery!

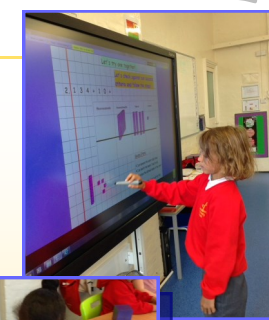


# Our First Week in Year 3

# Jam Sandwiches

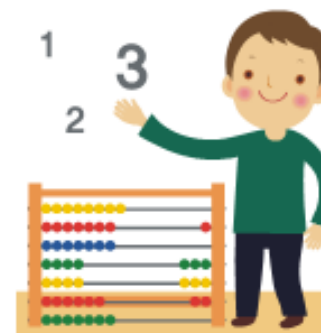

## Launchpad for Language



The school have invested in an exciting early years package with the Speech and Language Therapy service. Listening and talking are the key foundation skills for later literacy and academic achievement. Launchpad for Language is a fun filled language enrichment programme for all children in reception. It works with children, staff and parents to support all children to reach their communication potential with a particular emphasis on those with greater language needs.
